Introduction

Kristin Silverman's practice focuses on complex civil litigation, government investigations, and appeals. Kristin has special expertise handling class action lawsuits.

Kristin's recent cases have included defense litigation involving:

- Multinational corporation in antitrust lawsuits and investigations involving allegations of market collusion. After obtaining full dismissal of a federal putative class action and obtaining partial summary judgment in state litigation, resolved the remaining claims on favorable terms.
- Global asset management firm in federal litigation involving misappropriation of trade secrets and related breach of contract and fraud claims. Obtained dismissal on a motion for summary judgment.
- Major automaker in dozens of putative consumer class actions involving allegations related to the company's diesel vehicles. To avoid piecemeal litigation, successfully removed multiple cases to federal court for consolidation in multidistrict litigation.
- Several large banks against mortgage-related claims brought under the False Claims Act in federal district court.

In the appellate area, Kristin has successfully handled appeals in federal and state appellate courts across the country.

Prior to joining the firm, Kristin worked in the litigation department of Mayer Brown for eight years. She graduated with high honors and as a member of Order of the Coif from Chicago-Kent College of Law, where she served as an Executive Notes and Comments Editor of the law review. Kristin also graduated *cum laude* from Northwestern University with a degree in Journalism.
